10. Australian Biological Resources Study (ABRS) Grants Program

The aim of the ABRS Research Grants scheme is to support the documentation of Australia's biological diversity and to improve and increase the national taxonomic effort. The intent of the scheme is to support rigorous taxonomic treatment at species level and contributing to regional or continental generic or higher level reviews, including the development of identification tools.

The minimum level for grants is \$3000 and the maximum level of funding for grants is \$60,000, except in very exceptional circumstances. Funding is provided for: personnel, including postgraduate students, postdoctoral fellows and unattached workers; travel (including camping, travel and motor vehicle allowances); equipment; data processing charges.

11. Australia-Japan Foundation (AJF) – Funding for major and community-based project proposals

The Australia-Japan Foundation (AJF) invites funding applications for major and community-based project proposals in support of its objectives, which are to:

- increase understanding in Japan of shared interests with Australia;
- increase understanding in Australia of the importance of Japan to Australia as an economic and strategic partner; and
- increase recognition in Japan of Australian excellence and expertise.

In 2007-08 funding priority will be given to projects which seek to strengthen Australia's bilateral relationship with Japan in the following areas:

- Economics and Trade;
- Security, Regional and International Relations;
- Education;
- Science and Technology;
- Arts;
- Media; and
- Sport.

Australia-Japan Foundation grants are intended to provide seeding funds for innovative proposals relevant to the aims and objectives of the Foundation. This includes proposals which demonstrate the potential for the development of long-term links between individuals and institutions in Australia and their counterparts in Japan.

The Foundation assesses grant applications on the likely benefits a given project will bring, rather than

the amount actually requested, and it therefore exercises considerable flexibility in the amounts disbursed as grants and the conditions attached to these grants. While grants amount will be considered on a proposal basis for major grants, for smaller community type grants, it will generally be limited to a maximum of AUD 10,000. Where a project is of high quality, but financially beyond the Foundation's resources, it may decide to award the applicant a grant conditional on funds being raised from other sources.

15. Radcliffe Institute for Advanced Study – Fellowships 2008-2009 for Natural Scientists and Mathematicians

Radcliffe Institute fellowships are designed to support scholars, scientists, artists, and writers of exceptional promise and demonstrated accomplishment who wish to pursue work in academic and professional fields and in the creative arts. In recognition of Radcliffe's historic contributions to the education of women and to the study of issues related to women, the Radcliffe Institute sustains a continuing commitment to the study of women, gender, and society. Applicants' projects need not focus on gender, however.

Stipends are funded up to US\$70,000 for one year with additional funds for project expenses. Some support for relocation expenses is provided where relevant. Fellows receive office or studio space and access to libraries and other resources of Harvard University during the fellowship year, which extends from early September 2008 through June 30, 2009. Fellows are expected to be free of their regular commitments so they may devote themselves full time to the work outlined in their proposal.

17. NHMRC Equipment Grants (standard) allocated for 2007

The NHMRC has advised that a sum of \$896,666 has been allocated to Monash University as Standard Equipment Grants for 2007. This amount has been calculated by allocating funds pro rata to the NHMRC health and medical research grants held by Monash University in 2007.

The NHMRC has clearly defined objectives for awarding Equipment Grant funding, which are:

the need for institutions to be strategic in the purchase of larger items of equipment that will benefit health and medical research in Australia;
institutions are encouraged to support equipment that will be used collaboratively; and
where possible, Australian-made equipment should be purchased.

Selection Criteria

The following factors should be taken into consideration when making decisions on the equipment to be supported:

The equipment should support highest quality health and medical research, as supported by the NHMRC (or other competitive grant process);
Lack of access to similar equipment in the institution or region and;
Collaborative gain through use of the equipment, e.g. - multi-user equipment which crosses disciplines, research groups and departments.

23. Marie Curie International Outgoing Fellowships for Career Development

The Marie Curie International Outgoing Fellowships for Career Development support European researchers to work outside of Europe, on the following terms:

- The fellow spends 1-2 years on secondment in a so-called third country (such as Australia) then 1 year back at their home country for a mandatory 're-integration period'
- The EC covers 100% of the cost of the researcher's salary plus a contribution to overheads
- The project must include a coherent research programme.
- The researcher is free to choose the topic in collaboration with their home institution. The researcher needs an agreed personal career development plan in place with her or his host institution - this will be annexed in the funding agreement, which will be between the 'return host' (ie the researcher's home institution) and the EC.
- The fellow needs to be a national of an EU member state or associated country, and needs to either hold a doctoral degree or 4 years full-time equivalent research experience. The researcher must not have resided or carried out their main activity (work, studies etc) here for more than 12 months of the 3 years prior to the deadline for the application submission.

25. Australian Academy of Science - Australian participation in European Cooperation in the field of Scientific and Technical Research (COST)

The Australian Academy of Science is inviting applications from Australian researchers to participate in European research networks known as COST Actions. COST is a system for research collaboration covering 34 European Member States in 9 scientific research areas (research domains).

In order to deliver the project, the Academy and COST have signed a reciprocal agreement to be trialled for an initial period of two years, which establishes the basis for Australian and European scientists to participate in COST Actions. Under the terms of the agreement and under COST guidelines, Australia is regarded as a country with reciprocal arrangements. Australian researchers travelling to Europe may receive a grant of up to \$5,000 per visit (up to \$2,500 towards an airfare and up to \$2,500 towards daily living allowances), to participate in meetings and short term scientific missions. These meetings/missions must be for five days minimum and three months maximum duration. COST grants up to €2,500 to the European scientist, for travel and subsistence expenses to and within Australia.

Applications are approved and funded in chronological order of receipt until funds have been committed.
